Claudaline sends Easter greetings to Cambourne Church and some further news about her ministry among children and families in Goma with the development charity ASDIG. She remains very grateful for our support and prayers.

In the photos, Claudaline is handing out plastic bags of food: a mixture of maize, soya sorghum, rice and sugar to make the local staple food of porridge – 2-5 kg each depending on the size of the family. She is concerned



about malnutrition among many for the children at school and the fact that they are often poorly clothed and come to school without shoes. Her team is also able to provide some medical support for a variety of illnesses, including malaria.

One girl in our home sat for national exam for primary certificate and she performed well. Anna got 328 marks out of 500. This was not bad considering that last year there was a long break caused by covid-19.

You can also pray for our church as we are raising funds to buy a piece of land for the church to construct a Sunday school church.

We are also grateful to God the churches were allowed to resume services this month. This news was received well by our members because they have missed church so much and online services do not work for them because most of them do not have smart phones and they cannot afford bundles at the same time to pay for the internet.
