This leaflet introduces you to Cambourne Church and to various aspects of the life we share together. We hope you will find it helpful – please introduce yourself to one of our welcome team on a Sunday, or contact the Church Office if you need further information.



What sort of church are we?

Cambourne Church is the parish church for Cambourne and a local partnership of 4 Christian denominations:

- The Baptist Union
- The Methodist Church
- The Church of England
- The United Reformed Church Cambourne is a 'young' community so we are also an 'emerging church' in some respects.

What matters to us?

We are committed to being a Christian community which is open, prayerful and loving, which serves Cambourne with the good news of the gospel, and where disciples of Jesus Christ are formed.

What happens on Sundays?

On most Sunday mornings we have two services in the church building:

- at 9.30am a more reflective, traditional service lasting approximately 60 minutes; includes bible readings, hymns/songs, a 15-20 minute talk and prayers
- at 11am a more contemporary service with a worship band, lasting approx. 75-90 mins; includes sessions for children (Young Church) and young people (Xtreme); we normally all gather together before the children and youth leave for their own group sessions and they come back to join us before the end of the service

Refreshments are available between the 2 services and after the 10am and 11am services.



What happens during the week?

A wide range of mid-week fellowship groups and events take place throughout the week to cater for all ages, needs and interests. See the church noticeboard or website for more details of any of the groups and activities listed below.

Weekly groups:

House Groups including Bible Study on different days across Cambourne; Men's Footie (Mondays); Gazebo (Wednesday after-school club for Years 3-5); Parent and Toddler Space (PTS) (Friday afternoons).

Fortnightly groups:

3Cs (alternate Monday afternoons for seniors); **Cavendish Fellowship** (alternate Monday afternoons in the lounge for the residents of Cavendish Court)

Monthly groups:

Pub Lunch Forum; Father and Children's Breakfast; Men's Network.

As well as the regular groups and activities listed above, we also hold occasional **social events** open to all, e.g. quiz night, ceilidh, and safari supper.

From time to time we also run **short courses** offering the chance to explore what Christianity is all about, e.g. Alpha.

During the summer holidays, the church sometimes runs a Holiday Club or Family Fun Days.
